
Report of the ICHM to the IMU 2014-2018

June Barrow-Green (Chair)

From March 2014 to March 2018, the International Commission for the History of Mathematics (ICHM) has continued to pursue its dual aims of encouraging the study of the history of mathematics and of promoting a high level of historically and mathematically sophisticated scholarship in the field internationally. It has done so in the following ways:

Meetings of the Executive Committee (EC) of the ICHM

The EC meets at least four times yearly via e-mail to discuss matters of interest to the international history of mathematics community. Among the business discussed and the issues considered over the four-year period from 2014 to March 2018 were: the drafting by the IMU in consultation with the ICHM of ICHM terms of reference for inter-union commissions (these terms having been approved by the ICHPS/DHST at the ICHST2017 in July of 2017); the renewal and election of new officers and members of the Executive Council of the ICHM, as well as the appointment of national representatives to the ICHM; the approval each year of conferences and symposia for ICHM co-sponsorship (see below); the organization of symposia for the 25th ICHSTM (2016-2017); consideration and discussion of annual reports submitted by the Treasurer of the ICHM and the consideration and discussion of annual reports submitted by the editors of the ICHM's journal Historia Mathematica; the editorial transition of Historia Mathematica; the selection of the ninth Kenneth O. May Medallists and the selection of the third Montucla Prize winner (2016-17); symposium on history of mathematics for the ICM (2018); the migration of the ICHM webpage from a webpage hosted by the University of Zaragoza to a webpage hosted by the IMU for commissions of the IMU.

Publications

Historia Mathematica is the official journal of the ICHM. It appears four times annually and publishes roughly 525 pages of original research in the history of mathematics from all times and cultures. From 2014 to 2015, it was edited by Niccolò Guicciardini (Italy) and Thomas Archibald (Canada). From 2015 to 2016, it was edited by Thomas Archibald (Canada) and

Reinhard Siegmund-Schultze (Norway). From 2017 has been edited by Reinhard Siegmund-Schultze (Norway) and Nathan Sidoli (Japan). It is published by Elsevier Science.

Medals and Prizes

The **Kenneth O. May Prize** is awarded every four years to a historian or historians in recognition of distinguished contributions to the history of mathematics. The Prize is administered by the ICHM.

Kenneth Ownsworth May (1915-1977) was a distinguished American mathematician and historian of mathematics who spent the last ten years of his career at the University of Toronto. The first May prize was awarded in 1989; to date there have been 12 winners. The recipient of the Prize also receives the May Medal, a bronze medallion cast from a design created by the Canadian sculptor Salius Jaskus. The two winners of the May Prize for 2017 were Eberhard Knobloch and Roshdi Rashed. The Prize was presented to Professor Knobloch by Craig Fraser, chair of the ICHM, in July 2017 at the International Congress for the History of Science and Technology in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The Prize was presented to Professor Rashed by Karine Chemla in Paris, in November 2017.

The **Montucla Prize** is an honor established in 2009 by ICHM to recognize research in the history of mathematics. The prize is awarded every four years to the author of the best article published by a young researcher in Historia Mathematica in the four years preceding the International Congress of History of Science and Technology.

The prize is named after the great eighteenth-century historian of mathematical science Etienne Montucla, one of the founders of the modern discipline of the history of mathematics. The Montucla Prize for 2017 was awarded to: Jemma Lorenat, for "Figures real, imagined and missing in Poncelet, Plücker, and Gergonne," Historia Mathematica 42.2 (2015). The prize will be presented to Dr Lorenat by June Barrow-Green at the ICM in Rio in August 2018.
